I-94 North-South Freeway Project information

ABOUT THE PROJECT

- Stretches 35 miles between the Mitchell Interchange in Milwaukee, through Racine and Kenosha counties to the Illinois state line.
- The \$1.9 billion project will expand the interstate to four lanes in each direction and redesign 17 interchanges.
- Construction began in 2009 and will be complete in 2016.

County C & WIS 165 Construction Update

In spring 2010, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is continuing construction on the I-94 North-South Freeway project. As part of the I-94 North-South freeway project, WisDOT is reconstructing the County C roadway, the County C entrance and exit ramps, and the WIS 165 northbound entrance and exit ramps in 2010.

Construction on the WIS 165 northbound ramps will begin April 1, 2010. The ramps will be closed to traffic for two months, and traffic will be detoured to County C to the east frontage road.

Once construction on the WIS 165 northbound ramps is complete, the northbound and southbound County C entrance and exit ramps will be closed from June through December 2010. County C under the freeway and the east frontage road from County C to WIS 50 will also be closed during that time. Traffic can use the frontage roads or the WIS 165 interchange as alternate routes.

Work also continues on the section of mainline freeway from the Illinois state line to south of WIS 50 in Kenosha County. Traffic will be reduced to two lanes in both directions, with northbound traffic crossed over onto southbound lanes. The frontage roads, US 45 or WIS 31 are available as alternate routes.
