I-94 North-South Freeway Project information

ABOUT THE PROJECT

- Stretches 35 miles between the Mitchell Interchange in Milwaukee, through Racine and Kenosha counties to the Illinois state line.
- The \$1.9 billion project will expand the interstate to four lanes in each direction and redesign 17 interchanges.
- Construction began in 2009 and will be complete in 2016.

Edgerton Avenue & Ramsey Avenue Construction Update

In early spring 2010, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is continuing construction on the I-94 North-South Freeway project.

Beginning March 29, construction on I-94 over Edgerton Avenue and Ramsey Avenue will occur through late fall 2010. During that time, both streets will be closed to through traffic from 13th Street to 20th Street, but open to pedestrians and bicycles. Howard Avenue, Grange Avenue or College Avenue are available alternate routes in the area.

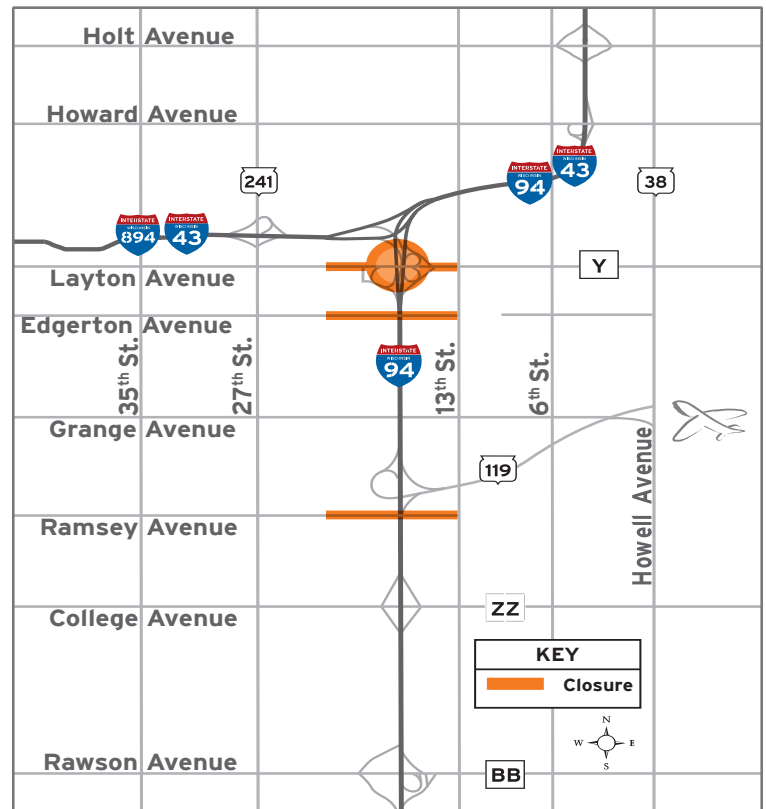
There will be occasional full closures where the roadway and sidewalk will be closed (even to pedestrians and bikes) for roadway demolition and construction.

Residents should also be aware that Edgerton Avenue and Ramsey Avenue will re-open in late fall 2010 but they are scheduled to close again in early spring 2011 through late fall 2011.
