I-94 North-South Freeway Project information

ABOUT THE PROJECT

- Stretches 35 miles between the Mitchell Interchange in Milwaukee, through Racine and Kenosha counties to the Illinois state line.
- The \$1.9 billion project will expand the interstate to four lanes in each direction and redesign 17 interchanges.
- Construction began in 2009 and will end in 2016.

Mitchell Interchange advance utility work

As part of the I-94 North-South Freeway project, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is conducting utility work in the Mitchell Interchange area in advance of interchange construction scheduled to begin in 2010. Operations include storm sewer and watermain installation, surveying activities, and the temporary relocation of a high-mast lighting unit.

Work on the storm sewers and watermain is scheduled to begin the week of July 20, concluding in Spring 2010. There will be an increase in construction vehicles, equipment, and materials hauling in the area as a result of this work. Equipment will access construction sites on I-894/I-43 near 20th St. and between 16th & 20th St. along Bottsford Ave. and Whitaker Ave.

Beginning the week of July 13, WisDOT will conduct survey work in pre-identified areas in the Mitchell Interchange. These activities include recorded visual inspections of properties identified near vibration-causing operations or where soil settlement is possible.

WisDOT continues the staged removal of existing high mast lighting in the Mitchell Interchange. A high mast lighting tower in the Mitchell Interchange infield will be moved to the west side of the freeway near 16th St. & Bottsford Ave. the week of July 13. This relocation is temporary, as all units will be replaced with permanent, street-level lighting between 2010 and 2012. All high mast lighting will be removed from this area by the 2012 construction season.
