## ABOUT THE PROJECT

- Stretches 35 miles between the Mitchell Interchange in Milwaukee, through Racine and Kenosha counties to the Illinois state line.
- The \$1.9 billion project will expand the interstate to four lanes in each direction and redesign 17 interchanges.
- Construction began in 2009 and will be complete in 2016.

## WIS 50 East Frontage Road Construction Update-July

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is continuing reconstruction of the WIS 50 east frontage road.

Stage 2 of the frontage road reconstruction is scheduled to begin the week of July 19, 2010. The existing east frontage road (120<sup>th</sup> Avenue) will be fully closed from 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 68<sup>th</sup> Street. The detour route for 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue is WIS 50, the west frontage road and County K. Additionally, traffic on 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be crossed over onto the northbound lanes, with one lane available in each direction.

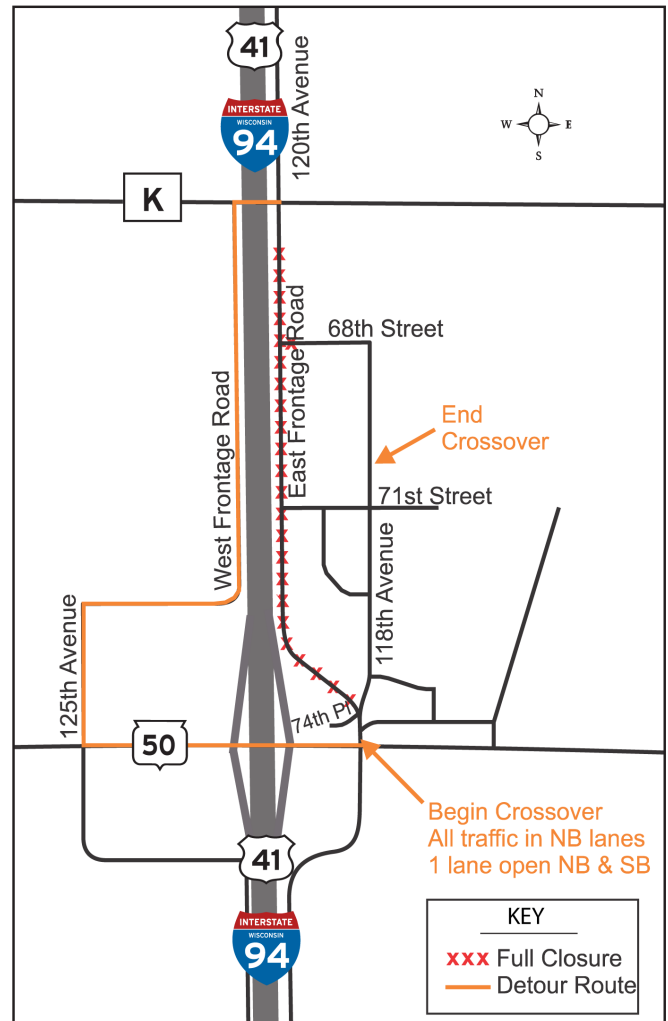
Access to local businesses continues to be maintained throughout the duration of the project. Construction is scheduled to be complete in Fall 2010. Please note that when construction is complete, the east frontage road will utilize 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be eliminated from 74<sup>th</sup> Place to 68<sup>th</sup> Street.

Motorists should also be aware that construction on the east frontage road between WIS 50 and County C is scheduled to begin later this summer.
